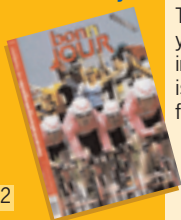

This is the house where Ludwig van Beethoven was born in 1770. Largely maintained in its original condition, the building now accommodates the biggest Beethoven collection world-wide: paintings and portraits, original manuscripts and first editions of meaningful works, Beethoven's last grand piano, his string-quartet instruments and his ear trumpets. It is also possible to see the room, in which the great composer was born. Already upon entering the inner courtyard the visitor feels to have stepped back into the time of Beethoven, which is due to the building's historical ambience. A tour around the twelve rooms of the museum provides a deeper insight into the life and work of the great composer. More than 150 original exhibits reflect Beethoven's way to thinking and feeling, of working and creating. The studio for digital collections and the stage for music visualisation in the Digital Beethoven House forms an interactive platform for the visitors.

## The Digital Beethoven House

The Digital Beethoven House has been open for visitors, with innovative and interactive information, in the historic neighbouring house "Im Mohren" since December 2004. The visitors can "multimedially" navigate through all sorts of documents in the studio for digital collections. The stage for musical visualizations transforms the historic cellar with vaulted ceilings into a total work of art of music and the virtual world. The price for your visit to this area is included the admission fee for the Beethoven House.

## International Beethoven Festival Bonn

The International Beethoven Festival Bonn annually presents some fifty concerts with classical music. The festival, which lasts three to four weeks between mid-September and mid-October, has become a great musical event. The event is also known for the variety of its musical venues – ranging from the Beethoven Hall and the Beethoven House in Bonn to Birlinghoven Castle in Sankt Augustin and the City Museum in Siegburg to the Kursaal in Bad Honnef and other locations in the region. Here, world-famous artists and young, highly talented musicians deal with Beethoven's musical heritage.

One of Germany's largest and most important natural history museums. Exhibitions with more than 3000 exhibits provide a fascinating insight into the diversity of the animal world. Founded in 1912 by the Bonn zoologist Alexander Koenig, the museum was closely linked with the history of the foundation of the Federal Republic. On September 1, 1948, the celebration to mark the opening session of the Parliamentary Committee was held in the museum's glass-roofed inner court. The meaningful scientific collections form the "heart of the museum" mainly concentrate on vertebrates and insects in terrestrial habitats. The museum's new permanent exhibition, "Our Blue Planet – Life in the Network" provides an exciting insight into how ecological life processes are networked and how they function. The sectors "Savannah", "Rain Forest", "Central Europe" and "World of Birds" are invitations for a discovery tour.

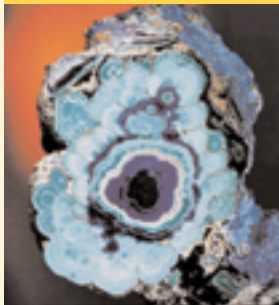

# Sights in Bonn

## **Altes Rathaus** (Old Town Hall)

Markt, 53111 Bonn, Germany  
Built between 1737 and 1738 under the rule of Elector Clemens August. The outside steps are world-famous, due to numerous receptions for state guests of high rank.

The Botanical Gardens do not only belong to the oldest ones, but with its stock of plants (approx. eight to ten thousand different species), also have one of the largest selections of different plant species of all the gardens in Germany. The eleven greenhouses, for example, are home to the largest water lilies in the world. Their leaves can bear a weight of up to 80 kg. Similarly, the Titan Arum with the world's largest flower attracted a record number of visitors.

This is the former summer palace of Elector Clemens August. Since 1818 it has housed the natural science collection of the University of Bonn. The surrounding park forms the Botanical Gardens today. In summer, the palace concerts are held in the courtyard and in the stucco-decorated Stucksaal.

The university boasts some 38,000 students and enjoys an excellent reputation at both the national and the international level. It is one of the ten largest universities in Germany. ## **Bonner Rheinpromenade mit Altem Zoll**

(Bonn Rhine promenade at the Old Toll Station)

Stretching 29 km along both banks of the river, Bonn's Rhine promenade is the longest single promenade on the Rhine and one of the most beautiful ones in Germany. Boasting an extensive network of cycle trails and pedestrian paths and some superb parks – including the court and city gardens of the University of Bonn and Bad Godesberg municipal park – the promenade is the perfect place to recover or keep fit. ## **Freizeitpark Rheinaue**

(Rheinaue Leisure Park)

Rheinaue Leisure Park, site of the 1979 National Horticultural Show, is situated right in the geographical heart of Bonn. 45 km of footpaths wind their way through the park – the Rhine bank promenade alone is 6 km long. Some of the park's main attractions are its boating lake, the Japanese Garden and the Garden for the Blind. 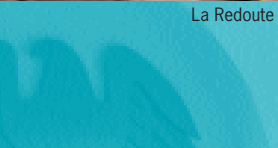

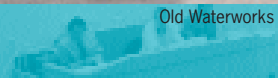

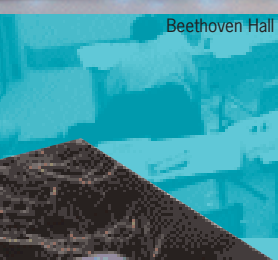

# The German UN-City on the Rhine

Bonn is synonymous with change – and this change is ongoing. The city that is symbolic of undoubtedly the most glorious period of German history, is today the second political centre of the Federal Republic of Germany, the official German representative city to the United Nations and offers the platform for dialogues concerning the future of the planet.

The heart of International Bonn is the district around the UN Campus that was completed in 2006. “The United Nations in Bonn – For Sustained World Development” is the thematic umbrella for the 13 United Nations organizations based in Bonn.

The work of these organizations and the pioneering conferences they are continually holding, issues are being lined up that are critical to the survival of humans on this planet. The United Nations organizations and the federal ministries, developmental organisations and more than 150 international, non-governmental organizations all form a strong network, from which impulses are being sent that are being heard around the world. Bonn's open-door policies are appreciated and the fact that the city strongly identifies with these projects adds to the city's attractiveness. Climate control, the fight against the ever-advancing deserts, natural disaster relief, health and dealing with conflicts are some of the tasks being undertaken and should be mentioned here.

The international press and media has also shown a lot of interest in these Bonn topics and conferences. A few examples include the conferences for the Member States (climate control and desert advancement), the UN-sponsored Afghanistan discussions that were held in Bonn, as well as the global environmental conferences, such as the International Fresh Water Conference in 2001, the Conference for Renewable Energies in 2004 and the Early Warning Conferences in 2003 and 2006.

Bonn is continuing to grow. The International Congress Centre in the former major meeting hall of the German Bundestag is already a sought-after location for meetings. An American-Korean investor, SMI Hyundai, has already committed to expanding the centre by the end of 2008 to include a large hall for up to 5,000 attendees, additional smaller meeting rooms and a first-class hotel.

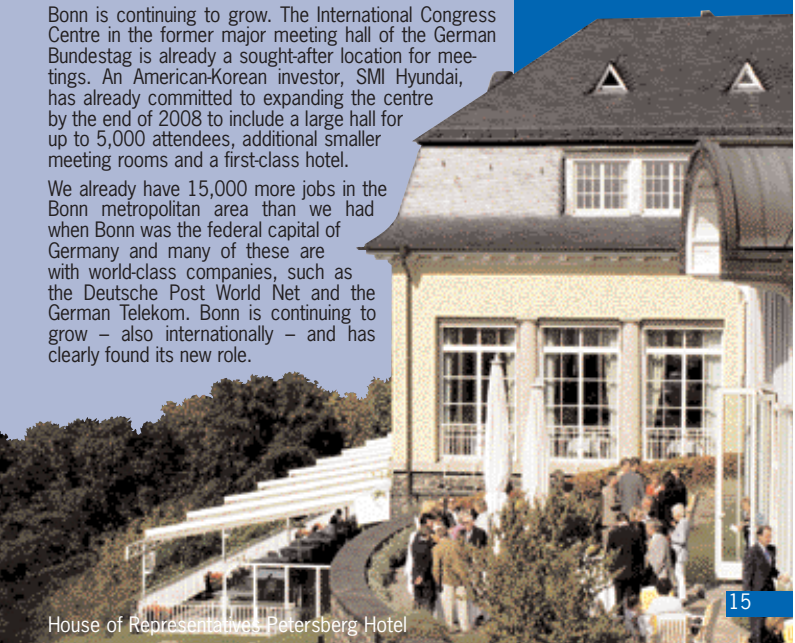

A particular attraction is the “Roemervilla”, a museum in Ahrweiler, which is built over the relics of a Roman manor house dating back to the second and third century A.C..
